Friends,

Here are some questions I have been asked since the Chofetz Chaim campaign began.

I humbly hope these answers help you see how important it is that you contribute generously to your Chofetz Chaim Day School.



Q: Why should I contribute to the Chofetz Chaim Day School?

A: Because I believe you're a Jew who is sincerely interested in the survival of Judaism.

Q: What do you mean?

A: If Judaism is to survive -- we must have schools of the Chofetz Chaim type. The education offered there forms the roots from which all other forms of Jewish education draw their spiritual sustenance. The Chofetz Chaim is the only school in this area offering this education -- in addition to subjects taught in "Public Schools".

Q: Isn't it only the more recent immigrants among Jewish parents who send their children to schools of the Chofetz Chaim type?

A: Of course not. I'd welcome the opportunity of introducing you to the parents of our Chofetz Chaim children. You'd meet many American-born, college-trained successful business and professional people who are members of Orthodox, Conservative and Reform groups.

Q: When you get down to it, though -- are schools of the Chofetz Chaim type really necessary -- really important?

A: Positively. As you know, we are a people by virtue of the Torah. Our Sages have always taught us that no enemy will be able to prevail over us so long as we uphold the Torah.

Q: So?

A: The kind of Torah-education which our Sages regarded as the best Jewish defense is provided in only one school -- the Jewish all-day school. In Greater Cincinnati -- that school is the Chofetz Chaim.

Q: In addition to Jews like myself -- who else ought to contribute to the Chofetz Chaim?

A: Every Jew who is sincerely interested in the survival of Judaism: Reform, Orthodox, Conservative. In fact, all Jews.
