This study should also move our young Torah scholars to strive for true greatness so that they can take their place at the helm of the Am Hashem and be qualified to guide its destiny.

The publication of Rabbi Chaim Ozer's biography fulfills an important need in Jewish life. The dearth of biographical material on Gedolei Yisroel has made it extremely difficult for the modern educator to become inspired by the lives of our greatest personalities, and to inspire his students with them.

Let us hope that Keren Hatorah will undertake many more such products 'Lhagdil Torah U'lhadirah'.
