

## Mr. Alfred B. Katz



As a true friend of Cincinnati Hebrew Day School from its very inception, Mr. Alfred B. Katz has taken an interest in the perpetuation of the school. He was instrumental in the founding of the school by serving as advisor and legal consultant to Rabbi Silver, z"tl.

Mr. Katz was a founder of Young Israel and Young Judea groups. He also participated in establishment of the Jewish Vocational Service and the Community Relation Committee.

Mr. Katz served as president of the North Avondale Congregation, the K'nesseth Israel Synagogue, Beth Am School and Camp Shor. He was also most active in the humanitarian efforts of Vaad Hatzalah to rescue Nazi victims during and after World War II.

He was president of the Jewish Community Center Senior Council, on the Board of the Bureau of Jewish Education, and a past delegate to the American Jewish Congress. He is a past director of Adath Israel Synagogue, and an officer of K.K. Beth Tefylo Association. He was the director of the Alfred M. Cohen Lodge of B'nai B'rith. He has served on the Boards of Bonds for Israel and the Jewish Welfare Fund of Cincinnati. He is president of Technion, and an active member of Jewish Family Service.

Mr. Katz has also served as president of Dunham Hospital and Reserve Officers Association. A veteran of World War II, he retired with the rank of Lieutenant Commander. He was President of the Reserve Officers Society of Ohio.

The senior partner in the Freiberg, Katz and Greenberger Law firm, he holds an LLB from the University of Cincinnati. He is a member of the Cincinnati, Ohio and American Bar Association, and a member of the American Trial Lawyers Association, and a former Assistant City Solicitor of Cincinnati. He is active in the business world and director of various corporations.

Alfred and Adele (Stillpass) Katz are the parents of Mrs. Mark (Ellen) Greenberger, Mrs. James (Ronna) Willis and Louis Katz, and grandparents of Craig and Jaime Willis and Jeffrey and Amy Greenberger.
