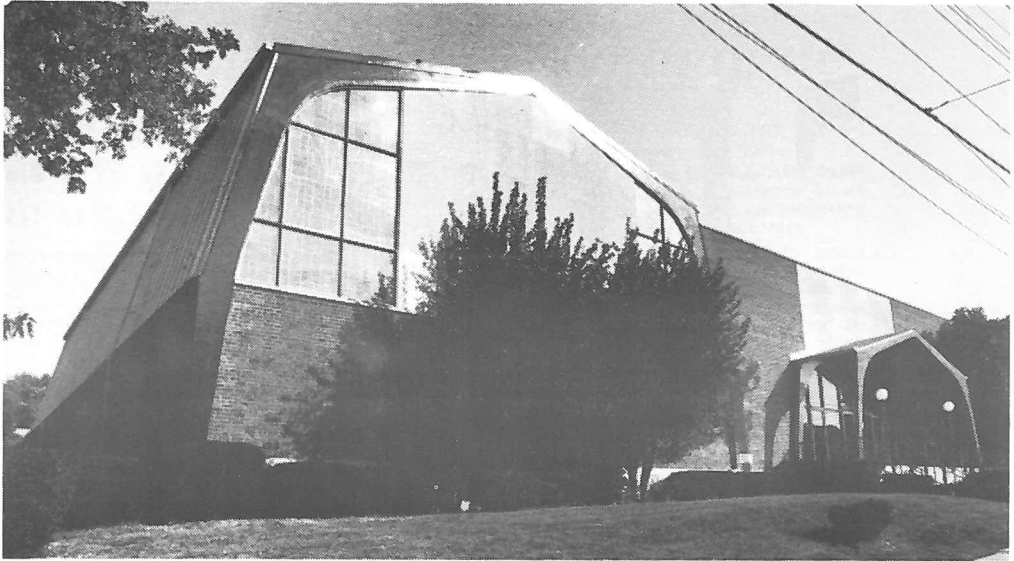


1968 New Synagogue Dedicated



Synagogue Dedicated

Friday, June 28, festivities to mark the dedication of the new sanctuary of Golf Manor Synagogue, Stover Avenue, began with a traditional Sabbath service at 8 p.m.

Rabbi Chaim Selger, spiritual leader of one of the largest synagogues in the country, located in Memphis, preached. There followed a social program with community singing.

The Sabbath morning service, June 29, was dedicated to founders and "elder statesmen" of the congregation. Members of the Sisterhood served luncheon after the service.

Formal dedication of the sanctuary was held at 2 p.m. June 29 with a Torah parade through Golf Manor. Rabbi David Indich offered a brief prayer on the synagogue steps, the ribbon was cut, and keys presented.

The Torahs (scrolls) were carried in and a short service conducted.

A champagne hour and candle-light dinner Sunday, June 30, concluded the dedication program. Rabbi Samson Weiss, executive vice-president of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations, delivered the principal address. Lou Norman, Jewish humorist, entertained.

Mayor Eugene Ruehlmann of Cincinnati, Mayor Thomas Dunlap of Golf Manor, and Judge Benjamin Schwartz also took part.

The new sanctuary, costing \$25,000, contains a youth lounge, lobby, study, executive offices, board room and kitchen.

Besides the new construction, the Liebowitz of the congregation was renovated and decorated.
