He treated my father with the utmost respect and was going to allow my father to have his pulpit for my son, Edward's, Bar Mitzvah. That is a tremendous thing for a Rabbi to do but Rabbi Indich was secure in himself and full of respect for others.

My father died suddenly at 5:30 in the morning. You knew you could call the Rabbi no matter what time and we did. Rabbi Indich was there immediately for all of us.

When our daughter, Andrea, got married his speech under the chuppah was so perfect that we sometimes put her video on just to hear him.

In times of joy and sorrow, he always knew what to say to make you feel good, usually with an appropriate joke. Even though he had his own health problems they never got in the way of his helping others. He was always there for you. We miss him!
