FACTS FOR PASSOVER FROM
HANDBOOK PREPARED BY
RABBI JACOB J. HECHT

SELLING CHOMETZ

PURPOSE: The Torah being concerned about the economic welfare of the Jewish people, has provided for one contingency where, due to the laws of Passover, a loss might result through the destruction of large quantities of Chometz, by allowing us to sell it to a non-Jew. Inasmuch as all dishes used during the year contain Chometz, every household is vitally concerned.

METHOD: By the legal transfer of Chometz property to a non-Jew, we are no longer the owners of it, and, therefore, do not carry any responsibility for it.

The legal intricacies covering such a transfer of property are many and involved, and only an orthodox Rabbi should be entrusted with its execution, in the same manner in which we entrust our secular legal affairs to a trained and bonafide lawyer.

FAST OF THE FIRST BORN

When the A-mighty slew the first born of Egypt, He spared those of the Children of Israel who, because of idolatry, deserved to share the same fate.

Therefore, all first-born sons of Israel fast on Passover Eve in gratitude to the A-mighty.

It has, however, been a custom for many centuries that this fast day is broken by a Seudas Mitzvah, that is by a festive meal in celebration of a Mitzvah such as the "Siyum" meal at the conclusion of a study of the Book of the Talmud.

Therefore, all first-born sons of either parent who are unable to fast should study a tractate of the Talmud and conclude this study on the morning of Erev Pesach.

In cases where such study is not possible, the first born may participate in the final study period conducted by the Rabbi on the morning before Passover immediately after the morning service. It is customary for the father to fast for a first-born male child under thirteen years of age.

KOSHERING FOR PESACH
DISHES AND UTENSILS

Since we are not permitted to have any trace of Chometz during Passover, special attention must be given to dishes and utensils. It is best to use dishes and utensils especially set aside for use on Passover. However, if necessary some utensils used during the year may also be used on Passover, providing they have first been properly Koshered. (For details consult your Rabbi.)

QUESTIONABLE ITEMS

The following is a list of questionable items, and they may not be used unless an Orthodox Rabbi is consulted.
