PESACH MESSAGE

Since I am writing this message for the Pesach resp. Summer Bulletin, we are still under the impact of the agonizing "Libyan plane incident" and the new murders of the "Black September" terrorists which show that our world is not at peace yet and that we, the Jewish people are as the Midrash expresses it, like the "scattered lambs."

In one of my recent Shabbos Sermons I dwelt upon this theme of collective responsibility which so deeply is rooted in Judaism and Jewish history. The transgression of a single individual caused a change upon the nameplate of the sinner's tribe which the High Priest wore upon his heart. If one person somewhere in the land of Israel acted contrary to the established and accepted discipline of the Torah his act reflected negatively upon his entire tribe. This notion of human inter-dependence in Jewish life is tragically reflected in our entire destiny. When Golda Meir was taken to task, it seems, as the representative of a people "that should be merciful but acts so fiercely," she retorted that her first memory as a child was of a pogrom. "When we were merciful, we were weak and were led to the gas chambers." But we are sensitive to adverse impressions which may be caused by the improper behavior of any Jew in our midst. It seems that from the very dawn of history as a people, we were endowed with the distinctive feeling of collective responsibility. Unfortunately this law is not confined to feeling and sentiment alone. Our brethren in countries inimical to us are always endangered whenever incidents occur.

"Areivus" is the Hebrew word, collective responsibility. It has brought untold misery to our people but it also is the force that strengthens our people

to stand up and be counted, to face threats together and to alleviate suffering whenever and wherever it occurs.

As this is the bulletin for the summer semester where at vacation time two month hence organized synagogue activity dwindles markedly, let us be ever conscious of the fact that our personal involvement is called for and this cannot take a vacation.

Our involvement is called for more than ever in this 25th anniversary year of the State of Israel "Am Yisroel chai", so that "Israel will live."

A kosher Pesach to all.
