Yet, it is very easy to get so engrossed in business, culture, and all the forces of assimilation, that our Jewishness is sometimes pushed to the side. But this story tells us that no Jew really can cut the tie with his heritage. There always remains a pure and holy spark within each of us, which is capable of great acts of faith, material considerations not withstanding.

This Holy Season urges us to commune with our "inner spark" and let it come to the surface. The specific details of the story, hair and dress, may not be the marks of Jewishness - or the lack of it - today. In our everyday lives, however, there are forces testing us and our commitment. We all occasionally fail. Each of us, at our own levels of spiritual sophistication sometimes falls short of what is expected of us. But now, at these Days of Awe, the Holy One, Blessed Be He, demands of us that we step forward and perform acts of faith. On Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur, when all are engaged in prayer, this inner spark comes close to the surface of our beings. This is just the start, however. On the High Holy Days we pledge our lives. Like the young man in the story, Judaism is not something foreign that we must adopt. Rather, it is within everyone of us, awaiting liberation from the forces that prevent its free expression.

May the voice of the Shofar inspire us, call forward our deepest faculties of spirituality and true Jewish commitment, resulting in our own spiritual liberation and the liberation of all Israel literally.

Sunday, Sept. 15, we will need any men who are available to help get the Synagogue ready for the High Holydays. Please be at the Shul at 11:00 A.M.

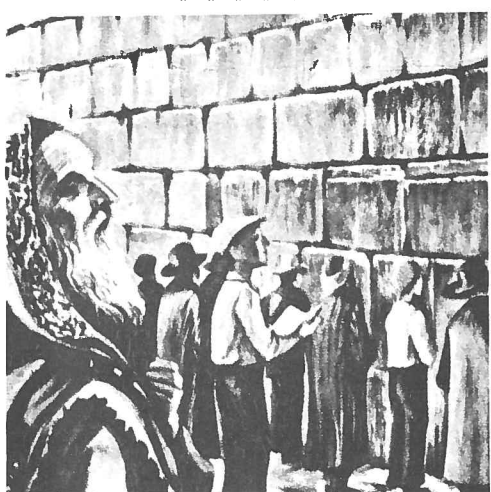
"ARBA MINIM"
