Once, the great Tzaddik, Rabbi Nachman of Breslav, was at a wedding feast. It was the custom in those days, that at such an occasion, there would always be a badchan, a jester, who would play musical instruments, clap his hands, and shout "Happy! Happy!" At this particular wedding, the jester grew tired and fell asleep. Someone went over, slapped him on the cheek and said: "Shout Happy!" The jester arose, and with tears from the pain of the blow falling from his eyes, cried: "Happy! Happy!" Rabbi Nachman was very moved by this, and cried: "Blows received, yet 'Happy' cried!"

It seems to me that this story is very appropriate to us at this time. The people in Israel are still surrounded by hostile neighbors, forced to make concessions which they know, may G-d forbid, hurt them later. The grief at the loss of so many young men just two short years ago, as well as the numerous casualties as the result of the senseless terrorist attacks, makes any holiday celebration seem somehow out of place. Even here at home, recession, inflation, loss of American prestige in world affairs, make everything we had trusted and depended on, seem very unsure and unstable. Many are out of work. The welfare rolls grow bigger by the day. Yet, in the midst of all this, Jewish law and tradition call upon us, to wake up, devote the Days of Awe to contemplate our situation spiritually as well as physically, let tears of penitence stream down our cheeks, and then come to the Festivals of Succos and Simchas Torah shouting: "Happy!"

It may seem super-human or even senseless to behave in this manner. But perhaps herein lies the strength of the Jewish people. We have cried many times. Other peoples may have been destroyed in their despair. G-d in his Torah has set for the Jew oases in time. Oases of joy, of introspection. Indeed, our hope is not lost. Even as our G-d and His Torah are ETERNAL, so is the

Jewish People. May G-d grant that this year we may shout: "Happy! Happy! without tears.
