It was at this university that Rabbi Benjamin Frankel in 1923. Upon his graduation from the Hebrew Union College, he organized the first chapter of our ever-expanding organization. Incidentally, now there are more than 180 units established by B'nai Brith at leading colleges and universities in the United States, Canada, and Cuba.

"Hillel" at Champaign is indeed an outstanding organization having a very large membership. There are numerous activities in which members may participate, some of which are folk dancing, "Hillel Players", their dramatic group, the music workshop, and Interfaith Activities.
