Each year there is a membership of from 1,000 to 1,200, with a very active Izfa Chapter. This month they plan to move into their new modern building, the Schunfarber Memorial Hillel Foundation, and the building will be dedicated on February 6th.

Their dramatic group, Hillel Players is considered one of the outstanding drama organizations on campus. Ohio State's Hillel is also very active in interfaith work, having among other things, a representative on the Student Council for religious affairs.. They meet for speeches and exchange dinners with other Foundations from time to time throughout the year and often send speakers to talk on Judaism to groups who request them.

They also have Hebrew classes, Jewish study classes, a choir, a musick committee, and an extension library in which they take great pride.

Another exemplary activity included is a personal service committee, which sends birthday cards to the members and visits the students who are sick. The chapter has a community service committee which sends students to Settlement houses to do social work with underprivileged children and conducts a clothing drive.
