

Programs of the monthly meeting have ranged from the report by one of our members on her recent trip to Israel, to a talk and discussion on job prospects for Jews led by the counselor of the Jewish Vocational Service in Cincinnati.

A camp weekend for Hillelites is one of our newer brainstorms. Our first one was held at Camp Livingston, 15 miles from Cincinnati, in early June, 1949, just after final exams. For a couple of days, we relaxed in the sun, got to know each other better, engaged in various games, discussed Hillel plans for the next year, and awarded our Sam Isralsky Memorial key for outstanding service in Hillel for 1948-49.

Hillel is a member of the UC Student Religious Council, which coordinates the activities of 11 student religious organizations and stimulates religious awareness on campus. We send two representatives to the Council.

On numerous occasions we in Hillel appear before Cincinnati B'nai B'rith and Temple groups in programs of light entertainment or serious discussions of Jewish problems.

A big autumn dance open free to all members and their dates is one of the red letter affairs of our social calendar.

Future plans include Hillel nights in various synagogues and Temples in which students will take over the services; study and discussion groups on current Jewish problems, Jewish music and dance, and Hebrew; a local radio program to be planned and produced by members; a glee club led by a distinguished outside expert; and affairs in cooperation with IZFA.
