LT. ALBERT FRANKLIN

Born in Cincinnati, October 1, 1917. Entered service July 24, 1943. Served 26 months as first lieutenant lead and pathfinder navigator, instructed lead crews in co-ordinating assembly, target identification and rally of groups. Flew 35 combat missions over Germany. Awarded Distinguished Flying Cross, Presidential Citation, Air Medal, Four Oak Leaf Clusters. Died on duty in the service of his country, August 16, 1951.
