

Rabbi Eliezer Silver Heads Jewish Flood Relief Body

Cincinnati, February 2 (WNS)—An emergency Jewish relief organization headed by Rabbi Eliezer Silver has been set up here to care for several hundred Jewish refugees from the flooded areas of Cincinnati, and nearby Newport and Covington, Kentucky.

Many Jewish business firms located in low-lying districts, which are under water, have suffered heavy losses. Through the local Red Cross, Rabbi Silver has arranged for the distribution of kosher food to the refugees here.

He has also made arrangements for the water-beleaguered Jews of Louisville to get kosher meat by means of a special transport system.

Hightstown, N. J., February 2 (WNS)—A shipment of 20 brand new winter coats for women has been sent to the Red Cross in Cincinnati for the flood victims by the 60 Jewish families of homesteaders who have been resettled here by the Resettlement Administration. The coats were made in the colonists' cooperative garment factory.

Cincinnati, February 2 (WNS)—Ten thousand pounds of fresh matzoth products from the Cincinnati plant of the B. Manischewitz Matzoth Company have been donated to the flood sufferers, according to word received here by C. A. Dykstra, city manager and dictator of the flood relief committee.

M. Dykstra announced that he was using the matzoth products in all hospitals and public institutions.
