



1965-66 Pilot project started in basement with four hearing impaired children.

1966-67 Rented quarters obtained in order to meet increased demand.

1967-68 Nursery program started to give children a head start in hearing education.

1968-69 The University of the State of New York granted us a charter.

1969-70 Acquired a building designed to meet our specific needs.

1970-71 After burglary, re-equipped school with the most advanced electronic hearing devices.

1971-72 Special infants' program providing a much needed early exposure to sound.

1972-73 First Graduation—students integrated into regular Hebrew Day Schools.

1973-74 Scientifically designed playground for development of motor coordination; EVALUATION and TESTING CENTER. . .

1974-75 Opening new division for perceptual learning disabled children.

1975-76 Building expansion to accommodate enlarged student body.
