Dr. Silver is the son of the late Rabbi Eliezer Silver, z"tl. Rabbi Silver, founder of Cincinnati Hebrew Day School (Chofetz Chaim), was a world-renowned rabbinic scholar who served as president of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis of the United States and Canada.

Dr. Silver is a graduate of the Yitzchak Elchanan Yeshivah University High School, the Yeshivah University College, the University of Cincinnati, and the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine. He served in World War II and was retired from the Army with the rank of Major. He is a member of Phi Delta Epsilon national medical fraternity, the Cincinnati Academy of Medicine, the Ohio State Medical Association, and the American Medical Association. He is a Fellow in the American College of Cardiology at the Jewish Hospital. He has served as Consulting Cardiologist at Longview Hospital for thirty years and is on the staff of Holmes Hospital.

In addition to their service to Cincinnati Hebrew Day School, both Dr. and Mrs. Silver have been active in communal and national Jewish affairs for many years. They are widely known for their successful endeavors on behalf of varied institutions, organizations, and Jewish causes.

Dr. Silver is a member of the Board of the Orthodox Jewish Home for the Aged and is Chairman of its Medical Advisory Committee. He also serves on the Boards of the Golf Manor Synagogue, Kneseth Israel Synagogue and the Jewish National Fund. He is a charter member of Jewish War Veterans Post No. 438 and is a member of the Physicians' Committee of the Jewish Federation of Cincinnati and the Zionist Organization of America.

Through the years "Lil" Silver has worked in many capacities for the Cincinnati Hebrew Day School P.T.A. Auxiliary. Included among her responsibilities were P.T.A. program chairman, publicity chairman, registrar, scoutmaster, and dinner chairman. She is also an active member of the Ladies Auxiliaries of the Orthodox Jewish Home, Golf Manor Synagogue, the Academy of Medicine, and Jewish Hospital.

Her many other activities include Mizrahi Women, Jewish National Fund, Pioneer Women, Hadassah, ORT, and B'nai B'rith. For the past eight years Mrs. Silver has gained wide recognition for her activities on behalf of Soviet Jewry. She serves on the Russian Jewry Committee of the Jewish Family Service and is a member of the Jewish Community Relations Committee for Soviet Jewry. She also serves on the Student Struggle for Soviet Jewry Committee in New York.

Dr. and Mrs. Silver are the parents of three children, Judy, Gerson, and Barry, each of whom is a graduate of Cincinnati Hebrew Day School (Chofetz Chaim).
