

After Zelig had been teaching in the Chofetz Chaim Day School for twelve years the school asked him if he would take over the position of principal which he did from 1966 to 1968.

In 1968, Rabbi Silver who was the Chief Rabbi of Cincinnati passed away. Candidates and representatives of many different synagogues listened to a few candidates from outside Cincinnati to see if



they were capable to take over the position. None of the candidates impressed them, so a few Rabbis suggested Zelig. He was voted in and he willingly accepted the position as Chief Rabbi of Cincinnati, Ohio, one that he has
